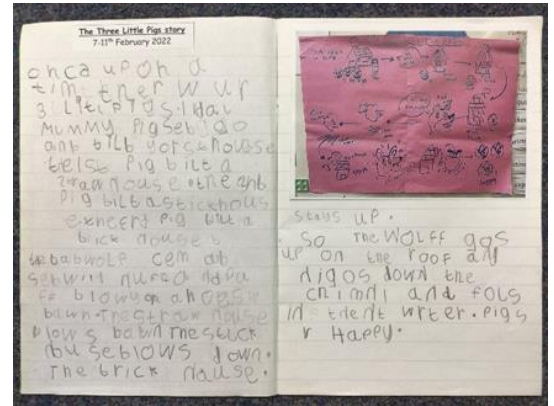

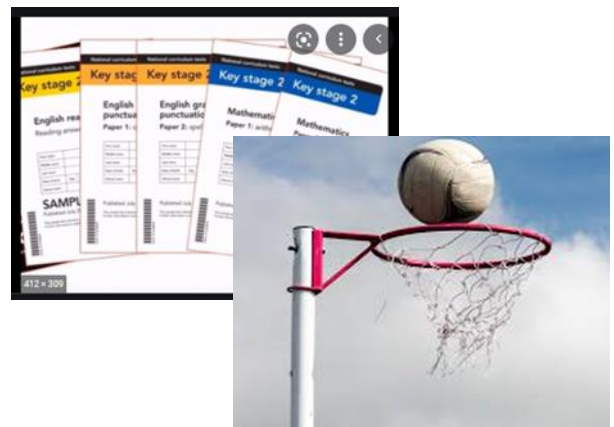


Hedgehogs Class

Having completed their practice SATs papers in the last couple of weeks, we intend to pass these on to the children to work on in their half term. READING/PHONICS PRESENTATION TO PARENTS: Mr Noble and I will be presenting reading/phonics to all parents on Thursday 3rd March straight after school. This will be an important meeting and we hope that all of our school community can attend.
